

In response to this peaceful love, we chose to create a world of disorder and harm.


Yet, you responded in peace, calling forth prophets, judges, and martyrs, to remind us of the origin of our beings, the centrality of our hope.

Yet in response to your love, we rebelled and sent our friend and hope to death on a tree.


Again, your peace prevailed, and in light and wonder you rose again, and re-entered our lives in the greeting; "peace be with you."



We honor and celebrate the human diversity and unity that God gives us in Jesus Christ. The Advent Wreath is a gift to the church in celebration of the season from Alice Raney.

Advent paraments: In 2012, First Presbyterian Church commissioned internationally known fiber-artist Laurie Wohl to design and create two paraments to be hung from the pulpit and lectern during Lent and Advent. The Advent text on the pulpit parament, in Hebrew and English, is from Isaiah 12:3: "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation." The Advent text on the lectern parament is from Luke 1:78-79: "The dawn from on high will break upon us to give light to guide our feet into the way of peace." We are grateful that the bequest of Anne 'St. Clair' Williams made it possible to enhance our sanctuary with these beautiful works of art.

Today's bulletin cover was created by *Isa Cummings*. While we often have a certain image of pigeons in our heads, the one on today's cover is drawn from images of the show pigeons that Esther Hethcox raised and that feature in her sermon.

★ The Lord's Prayer when Holy Communion is celebrated: From the beginning, one of the hallmarks of Reformed worship has been liturgy in the vernacular or in the common language of the people of God. Many, however, continue to use the language of another era (the Tudor dynasty) when praying the prayer Jesus taught. We hope that, by using this ecumenical version, new generations will learn and understand this prayer in a fresh way. Of course, you may always choose to pray in the words closest to your heart, be those words debts or trespasses.






