Happening Today

Today we have a special ***Lenten Service of Scripture and Song***. We hope you enjoy this music offering as we prepare for Palm Sunday and Holy Week. We thank ***Noelle Barr***, violinist, and ***Benjamin Barker***, hammered dulcimer and celtic harp player, for their contributions to today's service. Noelle Barr is a PhD student at Duke University. She holds degrees in music and art history and previously held a principal role with the New York Youth Symphony. Currently, Noelle performs with the Duke Symphony Orchestra and in chamber music ensembles in Durham. Benjamin Barker is National Hammered Dulcimer Champion, Harpist, and Music Teacher located in Greenville, SC. Benjamin has released two albums featuring solo hammered dulcimer: "Nothing but the Blood: Solo Hymns for Hammered Dulcimer" and "Bach: Complete Cello Suites Performed on Solo Hammered Dulcimer. Guest musicians are made possible by gifts to the Restricted Music Fund of FPC.

Today's bulletin cover was created by 10th grader *Kirbey Blackwood*. As we have made our way through Lent, one of the recurring images has been the extinguishing of a candle at the beginning of every worship service.

Today's lay liturgist is *Doran Cummings*, a confirmand. Members of the current confirmation cohort have been leading worship in this way throughout Lent.

This week we continue our practice of extinguishing candles as we move through our Lenten journey together. The Lenten "wreath" is covered in purple cloth and decorated with plum blossoms. We extinguish a purple candle which represents the patience we must exercise as we honour God's timing over Earthly timing. ***This week we invite you to ponder the hope and perseverance we must have as we wait upon the Lord.***

The *Lenten Banner* was completed in 1990 and dedicated in 1991. It depicts traditional Lenten symbols. The banner was made possible by funds donated in memory of *Bess Bryant* and by the stitching of many devoted members of this congregation.


